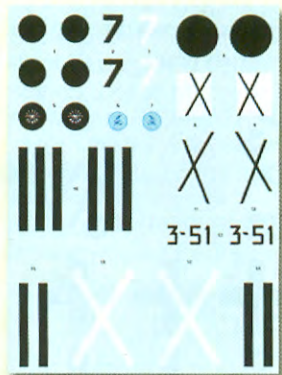

NOTES: It is a case of much of the same from Silver Wings with these two releases, and that is definitely not a bad thing. I've become very familiar with their products and have come to expect nothing short

of brilliance from this modest Polish cottage industry producer.

The fuselages in every Silver Wings kit come taped together as if to demonstrate well in advance just how precisely crafted these kits are, as even before any cement is applied the seam is virtually invisible.

Neither of these kits is ideal for absolute beginners to working with resin kits as biplanes present a far more significant challenge than your average monoplane, as properly aligning the upper wing is never an easy task and that is before any rigging is taken into

account. That isn't to say, however, that if the subject matter interests you, you shouldn't give either one a go. The engineering is such that even the less experienced modeller should be able to manage, provided you are willing to exercise appropriate amounts of patience during assembly.

It is the small details that really set these kits off, it is immediately apparent that a great deal of research and dedication has gone into the pattern work and it is the modeller who will benefit the most from this.
